Then Mum had this great idea. "Why don't you have a geo-caching party?" she said. I didn't know what geo-caching was, so she explained it to me.

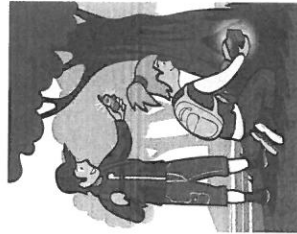
